



#### Library Update

WM Owney, PM started the day by cooking breakfast tacos for everyone.

Beginning the work, the brethren first removed all the books and tchotchkes from the Library & Heritage Room, the inventory taking up nearly all of the space on the mess hall tables. Next, they emptied the library space of all the bookshelves and furniture. One of the old desks was so large, it couldn't be moved through the doorway. Also, it was built so well, they weren't able to dismantle it with screwdrivers or hammers. So, PM Williams decided to use a chainsaw to reduce its size, finally being able to remove it.

SW Abe Wallace and Bro. Ricardo Avila visited with some cleaning solvents and mops to allow the group to clean and scrub the wood paneling in the room. Then the floors were vacuumed. PMs Dawson and Williams left with Bro. Foreman to load all the bookshelves that Max left the lodge into a truck and bring them back to the lodge. SD Clakely also cleaned out the utility closet, under the staircase, as it was well overdue for a cleaning.

After unloading the shelves, the group then



#### Merchandise Announcement


